Creating Independent Housing for Adults with IDD in Central WI

What started as a grassroots movement in 2019 formed by parents of adult children with disabilities and committed community members, Door2Dreams has become a moving and growing nonprofit organization, currently supported by the Community Foundation of Central Wisconsin. To address housing options for adults with disabilities, the board and advocates behind D2D has worked to secure property adjacent to The Grove (old convent) which plans to open to residents in 2028 should their funding goals be met.
