Better Together Survey Results

At the end of 2023, friends partnered in Better Together were given a survey to find out how being in the program has positively impacted their lives:

100% reported that their BT friend makes them feel HAPPY

100% reported that they feel that they've made at least one new friend since joining \mbox{BT}

100% reported that they feel that they've made more than one new friend since joining BT

100% reported that they feel more involved with their community since joining BT

91% reported that they feel they have a more positive mental health since joining BT

"You can just be yourself – it is enough to make a difference in someone's life.

"It is fun - come and join us!"

"You meet other people to do stuff with beyond just your BT friend."

"It gives an opportunity to give back and be given a happier experience."

"More people should get involved, it's not a lot of work, and it's so good."
